





NEW WEBSITE

IN LOVING MEMORY

BETTY O'BRIEN

Born on January 29, 1924 Entered Eternal Rest on July 21, 2019

We recently received news that our dear sister and friend, Betty O'Brien, passed away in July 2019. She was 95 years old, and was living in Georgia with her son. Betty was small in stature, but held an amazing heart of love within her. She loved Mary, Our Mother, deeply and often wore a rosary around her neck, both to be mindful of "her mom", and as a witness. Betty and her sister, Theresa, met and married brothers - Harold and Bill O'Brien. In the '80's Betty and Harold attended a Life in the Spirit Seminar in Lakewood, NJ.



Both were baptized in the spirit, whereupon their lives opened up to new graces and availabilities to serve the Lord. Betty and Harold were members of the Shore District of the POH for many years before moving north to the Koinonia Academy Campus. While at the Shore, they were married in the Catholic Church. Mary Ann Bastiaansen was Betty's "Maid of Honor" and she recalls what a graced time this was in her friendship with the O'Briens. While at the shore, Betty worked at the Pascale Insurance Agency. She and Harold lived on a boat, which was docked in a bay near Red Bank, NJ.

They entertained "many angels" as they offered lively and interesting hospitality. It was indeed a treat to go "out on the boat with Harold and Betty". Many great memories were made in their generous and holy hospitality.

Betty lived a lively youth. At age 18 she met up with Frank Sinatra in Hoboken, where he sang Happy Birthday to her. Betty was sitting next to Frank's mother, and upon his mother's direction "Frank sang to Betty". Betty loved to tell this story. In the WWII years Betty worked in the USO as a dancer, thanking and encouraging our soldiers in their service. Betty had a son and a daughter from her first marriage.

Harold and Betty furthered their "hospitality calling" by buying a large bus, which was parked on the KA campus for a number of years. Harold redesigned the interior and again they welcomed folks, driving many "wedding parties". They also drove people out to Stuebenville to attend Catholic Conferences.

Betty was a faithful and kind woman who loved Jesus and Mary with all her heart. May she rest in peace.
